SCHOOL CALENDAR INFORMATION

BOOKLISTS / COSTS FOR SEPTEMBER

SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

- <u>School Tour</u>: Children in Junior and Senior Infants, 1st and 2nd Class went to a Let's Go Activity Camp based in Knocknarea Arena, Sligo on May 30th. The 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th Class children went for their tour to Bay Sports, Hodson Bay, Athlone on June 10th.
- Sports Day: We held a very enjoyable sports day for all classes on Wednesday, June 12th.
- Say Yes to Languages: This term, the children in 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th Class took part in the Primary Language Sampler called 'Say Yes to Languages. The module introduced the pupils to Spanish and was taught over 8 weeks during the normal school timetable. Maria Sacristan was employed to deliver the lessons. The module was great fun and the children enjoyed every lesson. It also helps the children to appreciate the importance of languages as a life skill and provides an opportunity for the pupils to think in a different way and build opportunities for the future. The module was rolled out with the support of Languages Connect, a unit of the Department of Education.
- <u>Music:</u> Thank you to Music Generation Mayo who facilitated music lessons this year. The junior classes took part in the Ceol na nÓg programme whilst the senior classes learned the ukulele. A special thanks to

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Gráinne Hambly, who taught these lessons in Mayo Abbey NS. This was a very worthwhile experience and we hope to take part again next year.

- **SPHE (Social, Personal and Health Education)**: 5th and 6th class had a guest speaker, Noel Kearney, to complete the Relationships and Sexuality Education portion of the curriculum in early June.
- An Post Handwriting Competition: The children took part in the An Post Handwriting Competition this
 year. Although there were no prizewinners in Mayo Abbey, the children put in a great effort and their
 presentation skills were excellent. Well done to all who participated!
- <u>Organic Garden:</u> 1st and 2nd Class went to St Colman's Training Centre to visit the organic garden. The children saw polytunnels, the glasshouse, the orchard, field grown vegetables, the raised beds, and heard about composting and the wormeries. Thanks to the staff in the resource centre who facilitated this visit.
- <u>Blue Star Programme:</u> 3rd and 4th class took part in 'The Blue Star Programme' this year. This is an education initiative for primary school pupils to foster better understanding and knowledge of the European Union. The children carried out projects and took part in quizzes in relation to four key elements: the history, geography, culture and creativity, and Institutions of the EU. The children received a European Flag and certificates for their participation in this initiative.

- o 6th Class attended a 'Fun Football Day' in Balla Secondary School on April 25th.
- Children in senior classes attended the Cuman na mBunscol competition in Aghamore on May 3rd.
- o Infant classes completed a series of gymnastics lessons in 'Kids in Motion', Castlebar.
- Martin Costello, Mayo GAA Coaching Officer, completed some football training with all classes in the school during May and June.
- Auld Crafty: As part of our Creative Schools initiative, we invited Tom Delaney, known as Auld Crafty, to the school. He spent two days in Mayo Abbey NS. Tom is a basket maker living in Mayo Abbey. He spoke to the children about basket making and its history and demonstrated his craft in all classrooms. The children in the senior classrooms were very lucky to have the opportunity to make their willow bird feeders to hang in their gardens. Thanks to Tom for the visit!
- <u>Bird boxes:</u> The children in 3rd and 4th Class were invited to design some bird boxes in conjunction with The GAA Green Club Committee. The children rose to the challenge and designed boxes for owls, bats and garden birds. Mike, working on the RSS Scheme, has since made a number of these boxes and the children will paint them before hanging them in Abbey Park and on the school grounds. Thanks also to Mike for making an insect hotel for the school.
- <u>Information Night:</u> An Information Night for new parents took place on May 15th, 7-8pm. Thanks to the Parents Committee for organising the teas and coffees on arrival. It made the evening very welcoming for new parents. The children from the preschool in Abbey Tots then visited the school on June 10th as part of the 'Tús Maith' Transitions Programme. Everyone is looking forward to big school in September!
